Adding to the heartfelt atmosphere, Patron Mrs Goh Chok Tong delivered a special vocal performance, making the night truly memorable.

"Ding Yi stands as a proud representative of many including the arts community, young and emerging talents, the rich heritage of Chinese culture, social and charitable causes and most importantly the Singapore spirit," said Mr Lau Kam Yuen, Chairman of Ding Yi's Board.
